The word Advent comes from the Latin word "Adventus," which means "coming" or "arrival," and in the church it signifies the arrival of Christ. It is the beginning of the church year, also called the liturgical year. It is a time of excitement and preparation for observing the birth of Christ. Christmas is such a big event for Christians that we anticipate the day for weeks in advance, the period we call "Advent."

Advent begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas, and ends on Christmas Eve. This year, Advent begins on Sunday, December 2.

Yet, it is here that Advent finds us. Advent reminds us that in the midst of darkness, hope finds us. And the hope of Advent is that we will never be left to face our perils alone. In the midst of our pain, grief, and sorrow, God is with us. Fred Craddock once said, "I first went because I thought, 'Wherever Christ is, there is no misery.' But now I realize, wherever there is misery, there Christ is." Wherever you find yourself this Advent season, know that Christ is with you, especially if you are scared, lonely, or heartbroken. For in this season of hope, Christ our light "shines in our darkness and the darkness has not overcome it (John 1:5)."



Because that is what this is all about—it is about the people. It is about making sure our neighbor does not go hungry, not just on Thanksgiving or Christmas but every day.

In our hurriedness and busyness of the holiday season we can easily forget that we are called to serve; we can easily get so wrapped up that we forget to stop and thank God for the world we get to call home. So next time you are in the grocery store, remember the words of young Benjamin— "It's for the people."
