

Working with children can be exhausting, especially during the summer with camps, VBS, and running around. But one of the best parts of an exhausting summer is spending dedicated, slow time with our children. You see, during the school year our families are going a mile a minute. I get maybe, if I am lucky, one solid hour a week with our children. But during the summer I get five straight days of three hours a day, and then four days away at camp.

Planning for Our Future

Throughout the past several months, you've heard and seen information highlighting the long-term benefits that HAB can realize through the continued growth of our endowment fund. Since its inception in 2006, the endowment has already provided over \$80,000 in distributions to benefit our church and its mission. Our goal, which has been shared with you, is to increase its balance from the current level of \$275,000 to approximately \$1.75 million, which will provide enough to cover our capital maintenance reserve budget requirements each year. Reducing or eliminating this large annual budget item will allow additional funds to be used for other purposes such as missions and outreach.

Our goal was shared with you during the Palm Sunday service, and via a brochure that you received in mid-May. As is so often the case, this congregation has responded to our call. Thus far, between current contributions and pledged legacy/estate gifts, over \$850,000 has been committed to the endowment!

We are so grateful to share this progress with you! And we also hope that you'll consider providing for this cause, if you haven't already done so.
