### Combine in the Summertime!

In our Imagine 2020 conversations, the Worship Writing Team and Imagine 2020 Team were encouraged to figure out more ways to come together as a congregation in our Sunday morning worship, especially around the Christian practices of baptism, communion, and preaching. The final Imagine 2020 document contains this very goal. To that end, we have had more combined services so far this year than any other year previously since we moved to two worship services in 1999, particularly in November, December, and January. These combined services have involved a touch of creativity and imagination, especially at times entrusting our children and youth to take the lead.

As noted in our Imagine 2020 Vision, we have also explored other Christian worship traditions in our early service. In September, we held a morning jazz vespers around breakfast and conversation in the fellowship hall; in October, a Taizé service in the chapel; and in February, we worshipped together in the chancel area around the communion table with the morning's music centered on issues of social justice.

On Sunday, May 26, we will enter summertime, where we will worship together weekly at 10:30 a.m. for 15 weeks, returning to our regular Sunday worship times of 8:45 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. on September 8. Coming together to worship in summer makes sense on many levels, but mostly because our attendance patterns change greatly and our resources—both financial and human (laity and staff)—are typically spread thin. Look for these 15 Sundays this summer to be more relaxed, refreshing, and creative. You never know what you might encounter from Sunday to Sunday this summer: you may hear a new vocal ensemble; a different preacher; an arrangement of an old hymn performed by our band; a creative presentation of a Scripture passage; a guest instrumentalist; or a displayed piece of sculpture.

In another sense, we will continue to be the people of God—but come together—during a time of year most often symbolized by opportunities to play, grow, and renew. This will be a time for our worship teams (8:45 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.) who work tirelessly throughout the year to take a kind of sabbath and dream and plan for the upcoming liturgical year. Our band will have the time to rehearse and learn new songs for the early service; new people will be able to train for sound, visuals, setting up band equipment, and streaming video; and our Sanctuary Choir will be able to take a break in August.

Join us at 10:30 a.m. during the summer as we join our voices to pray, contemplate, and partake—together, as the HAB family—committing ourselves to continue to serve and worship our one true God in ways that are vital and faithful.
