Ever since Abigail was born, Courtney and I have been amazed at how little it takes to keep her entertained. For instance, Abigail has a box full of toys in our living room, yet she often plays with remote controls, pillows, and towels more than her own toys. Now, don't get me wrong. She still loves her toys, particularly her Disney dolls. But, it's amazing how often she finds contentment playing with everyday things left sitting around the house.

What's even more intriguing is how little she wants to play with toys when Courtney or I volunteer to play with her. When one or both of us get on the floor to play, the toys become almost obsolete. All that matters in that moment is time with Mom and Dad. The laughter and energy that come from simply chasing each other around the couch or wrestling on the floor far exceed the joy of playing with plastic toys. I don't mean to compare our interaction with her in a way that makes playing with toys a bad thing. Rather, I offer this comparison to highlight the value of relationships over possessions.

Obviously, we are in the season of Advent, the season of preparation and anticipation of Christ's birth. Yet, I'm convinced in a world saturated by ads, commercials, and flash deals, we are easily tempted to focus our attention on which presents we will purchase for our family and friends, and which presents we hope to receive from family and friends. There's nothing inherently wrong with this except that so often we miss out on the gift of simply being with one another.

After all, Advent reminds us that Christmas is a story about the God who wants to be with us. The name Emmanuel literally means "God with us." Our celebration of Christmas is a celebration of God's incarnation. The greatest present the world ever received is God's presence with us in the form of Jesus Christ. And perhaps we would do well to remember this same truth in our relationships. While we will no doubt share presents of all kinds, I do hope we remember to give the greatest gift of all: the gift of our presence. For there is no greater gift than the gift of uninterrupted time with those who know us best and love us most. May we share it abundantly.

The holiday season seems to come faster and faster every year. In seminary one of my professors said that Sundays seem to come around every five days, and I have the sneaking suspicion that we could now say the holidays come around every few months.

Even though I would love to start celebrating Christmas after Thanksgiving, the reality is we have already started getting ready for our Family Christmas Eve service and Night of Caring. A funny thing has happened while we have been preparing—I have started to feel the weight of anticipation differently. I have started feeling that desire and longing for the birth of our Savior.

Our children have started imagining telling the birth narrative in their own words, and while questions about the story have been asked and imagination has overflowed, there is a feeling in the air that we are getting a great privilege to tell this story.

And that is where I feel the weight of anticipation. I feel it when our children are excited to talk about how the shepherds must have been stinky or why Mary and Joseph didn't just ride their bikes to be counted. The weight is felt because our children know that this story is special. The weight of anticipation is felt when we know Thanksgiving is

right around the corner but we are eager to tell of the angels' proclamation of glory. Yet we know that we must wait—we must continue to ask questions about the birth story no matter how silly they sound. This Advent season let's tap into our inner child and ask questions and imagine this birth of our Savior with weighted importance and anticipation, knowing that we get to tell the story of the One who saves us every single day.

Within hours of the fire the leaders of the church determined that the sanctuary would be rebuilt within two years, and they committed to reopening on December 23, 2009. From the time of the fire and afterward, photographer Tim Rucci documented the devastation, as well as the rebuilding process. After the sanctuary was completed, the Art Ministry Team displayed an exhibit of Tim's photographs. The exhibit was called *Loss and Restoration*. Now Tim Rucci and the Art Ministry Team present *Loss and Restoration II*.

'Tis the season for many special and heartwarming traditions. One of them is definitely the giving and receiving of gifts. The best Christmas presents are often an experience to be shared, like dinner at a unique restaurant, or something that lasts all year, like a subscription to the Wine of the Month Club. I think we're participating in those kinds of gifts, giving and receiving, all year long at Hendricks Avenue Baptist Church. It's the gift of ministry, especially ministry that reaches beyond the walls at 4001 Hendricks Avenue.

Someone asked Gene this week if we are still doing "Pay It Forward" on Wednesday nights. The answer is "YES!" The money people give goes on a Post-it Note and on the board. When we have food we haven't needed for our suppers, we donate it, supplemented with food paid for by the Pay It Forward money, to San Marco Church, on the corner of Naldo and La Salle, for their Wednesday night suppers.

The pastor there is the Reverend Steve Painter. They do a meal every Wednesday, following a 6:00 p.m. worship service, for the homeless in our community. When Rev. Painter first came to San Marco Church, about 5½ years ago, the men's Bible study invited him to be their leader. He encouraged them to open it up to more than just men. There were six regular members. One member was homeless. Rev. Painter and the District Methodist Outreach minister worked together to seek God's direction for that group and their church. They prayed one prayer, "God, show us where you're working, so we can partner with you." The next week there were 20 people at the Bible study, 15 of them homeless.

They always served a snack supper after the Bible Study. That snack has grown into a full meal, and the study has grown into a worship service! It's all volunteers there, too, shopping for, cooking, and serving the meal. They are members of the college campus group, Wesley Foundation-sponsored, Campus to City Wesley, or CCW. They are serving an average of 75 people every Wednesday night! Rev. Painter says their guests love the nights they know it was cooked by the Food Services Team at HAB.

So back to the tradition of gifts. What a blessing it is to be part of a ministry like that. We share our gifts of extra food and an extra dollar here and there. And we receive the amazing gift of knowing we are at work in partnership with our brothers and sisters in Christ, God's church in the world.

Fall greetings from your campus partner, The Institute for Worship Studies! It's hard for us to believe we just celebrated our 20th anniversary as a graduate school and the start of our 5th year here on the HAB campus. Every January and June our students and faculty arrive for a week-long intensive academic session in either the Master of Worship Studies or Doctor of Worship Studies programs. This January IWS will welcome 118 students from 12 countries and 26 states to study and worship together with our exceptional faculty. We hold nine classes daily, morning chapel services, evening practica, provide three meals a day in the fellowship hall, and host a separate two-day worship seminar open to the public and our alumni.

Every session we have wonderful volunteers from the HAB family that join us in welcoming and caring for these students. HAB members also serve as host families for some of our students and volunteers around campus. We are looking for more volunteers!! Are you looking for a way to get involved?
