



This Treasure Within By B.J. Hutto, Senior Pastor

Friends,

If you look around yourselves, you'll see that the decade of the 1980s seems to loom large in our cultural imagination these days. You can hear its influence in popular music, and you can see it relived in television shows such as *Stranger Things*, *The Americans*, *Physical*, and *Chernobyl*. You can even see it at the intersection of sports and fashion, as more and more Major League Baseball and NFL franchises roll out "throwback" uniforms from that decade. Some of these trends might just be a manifestation of cultural nostalgia—people around my age wanting to relive something of their childhood and share some of it with their children—but part of me thinks that, embedded in this cultural moment, is also a realization of how the events of that decade have

shaped our current world in particular ways: the heightened tensions and then sudden collapse of the Cold War (as seen in Ukraine), the rise of video games as a subculture (currently the largest media industry in the world), the popularization of the home computer and the beginnings of the internet age (currently...everywhere!), and so on.

Alongside these broader shifts, the 1980s were even more eventful for Baptists like us. This is because that's the decade during which the old Southern Baptist Convention came apart. The timeline of this rupture can be bracketed by two dates. First, on May 10, 1979, the Georgia Baptist *Christian Index* published an article confirming that meetings had already begun amongst the leadership of the denomination's hard right in order to plot out a political takeover of the Convention. And then secondly, on May 9, 1991, the first convocation of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship was held in Atlanta, Georgia. As some of you may know, that first meeting in Atlanta was presided over by the Rev. Dr. Daniel Vestal. Because his daughter, Rev. Anne England, has previously served on staff here and because she and her husband, Jordan, are now active lay leaders at HAB, Dr. Vestal has long been a friend of our congregation, even outside of his leadership in CBF. **Thus, we are blessed to be able to welcome him back to Jacksonville on Sunday, October 1. On that Sunday, Dr. Vestal is going to be leading us in worship. Then, following worship, he is going to lead us in a lunchtime conversation about his recently released memoir,** *This Treasure Within***.**

While *This Treasure Within* is about Dr. Vestal's life and career more broadly, the controversies within the SBC and the development of CBF are discussed in depth within its pages. While these topics might appear at first to be old history, and while you might not count them amongst the most exciting topics of conversation, I'd ask you to consider this: Many of the issues that were being faced by Dr. Vestal and his colleagues back in the 1980s are still very much around us today:

What place(s) can women hold within the life of the Church? What power structures are in place to either support or suppress their gifts? What does it mean to have a critically informed faith and to raise and educate our children within a curious, informed community? How do we relate with neighbors of different belief systems, or simply different beliefs?

Since Baptist politics are largely small-d-democratic, what should it look like to exercise political power in community with people who disagree with you?

I could go on, but my hope is to encourage all of you to take part in this conversation with Dr. Vestal on October 1 and, between now and then, to grab a copy of his memoir and give it a careful read. Dr. Vestal is a wise man, and quite a bit of that wisdom was hard-earned as he lived and led throughout these years. My hope is that, through this book and through this conversation, we might all become wiser Christians as well.


